ACQUIRING CROWN LAND APPLICATION PACKAGE

To acquire Crown lands, the land must first be declared as surplus to the Government's needs.

Crown lands that are less than 20 hectares in size and surrounded by private lands on at least 3 sides, can be reviewed for declaration as surplus land. Parcels of Crown land with significant resource features which are required for Departmental programs or that form part of a larger block of Crown land <u>will not be</u> declared as surplus, nor will lands that are needed to provide access to other Crown lands.

All Crown lands that are declared surplus will reserve to the Crown:

- the bed of any river or lake below the ordinary high water mark (OHWM);
- all mines, minerals, oil, natural gas, and coals;
- all rights of fishing and fishery; and
- a right-of-way, 10 metres in width measured horizontally from the normal high water mark, along the bank of a watercourse or body of water for the general public to freely pass and repass on foot.

Lands may be declared as surplus either through an identification program carried out by the Department or through the review of an application.

If a property is declared surplus, it will be transferred to the Department of Transportation and Infrastructure (DTI) and sold by public tender, provided it is not needed by another government agency. The Department of Natural Resources and Energy Development may request that DTI notify all those who had expressed an interest in the lands be notified of any tender call. A survey plan may be required by the successful bidder.

\$1,725.00 non-refundable (\$1,500.00 + \$225.00 HST)

*Fees are established in accordance with the Lands Administration Regulation - Crown Lands and Forests Act and are subject to change.

PROCESS

Your application will be reviewed by the Department of Natural Resources and Energy Development in consultation with other agencies. The review process is expected to take between 6 and 12 weeks and may take longer depending on the complexity of the application.

Requirements that MAY be requested upon approval of the application

<u>Environmental Insurance</u>: Environmental Remediation Insurance must be purchased and maintained by the Lessee. It is intended to cover the cost of rehabilitating the Crown land should an environmental accident occur.
